Gospel of Luke

A Walk to Remember

Luke 24:13-27

¹³ Now behold, two of them were traveling that same day to a village called Emmaus, which was seven miles from Jerusalem. ¹⁴ And they talked together of all these things which had happened. ¹⁵ So it was, while they conversed and reasoned, that Jesus Himself drew near and went with them. ¹⁶ But their eyes were restrained, so that they did not know Him. ¹⁷ And He said to them, "What kind



of conversation *is* this that you have with one another as you walk and are sad?" ¹⁸ Then the one whose name was Cleopas answered and said to Him, "Are You the only stranger in Jerusalem, and have You not known the things which happened there in these days?" ¹⁹ And He said to them, "What things?" So they said to Him, "The things concerning Jesus of Nazareth, who was a Prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, ²⁰ and how the chief priests and our rulers delivered Him to be condemned to death, and crucified Him. ²¹ But we were hoping that it was He who was going to redeem Israel. Indeed, besides all this, today is the third day since these things happened. ²² Yes, and certain women of our company, who arrived at the tomb early, astonished us. ²³ When they did not find His body, they came saying that they had also seen a vision of angels who said He was alive. ²⁴ And certain of those *who were* with us went to the tomb and found *it* just as the women had said; but Him they did not see." ²⁵ Then He said to them, "O foolish ones, and slow of heart to believe in all that the prophets have spoken! ²⁶ Ought not the Christ to have suffered these things and to enter into His glory?" ²⁷ And beginning at Moses and all the Prophets, He [□]expounded to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself.

1. List as many things as you can of of what these two persons may have been discussing on their walk to Emmaus. How were they feeling?
2. Why do you think "their eyes were restrained" in v. 16? What are other reasons why they may not have recognized Jesus?
3. Jesus could have revealed himself to them, instead what did He do?
4. What are some things you may have in common with these disciples?
5. Just as these two disciples were walking with Jesus, how is your walk with Jesus? Do you turn to His Word and His promises? Do doubt it or believe it? Are you walking in sadness or joyfully because He has risen? Who are you telling about the risen Christ and have you told anyone lately?
