Love Gifts

Christians often give *love gifts* to show tangible appreciation for someone special in their life. Usually they are so special that the love gift isn't a planned budget item, but rather it's given voluntarily, spontaneously, and generously from one's personal savings. Love gifts are extra special and when received, are usually cherished more than ordinary gifts since they are gifts of the heart not just from the wallet. Such gifts aren't just an honor to receive, they actually do something marvelously wonderful to the heart and mind of the one receiving it. Love gifts truly represent an extra generous expenditure prompted by sincere altruistic (agape / sacrificial) love that's an invisible part of the gift. A love gift transforms whoever gets it, regardless of what it is or how much it costs. Beyond something to wear, use, or gaze upon, love gifts tenderly touch the heart, mind and soul with blessedness and spiritual regeneration.

Any love gift is forever special no matter what it is, but there are some love gifts that are so special they can't wait until a special occasion like Christmas to receive. Sometimes you hear of a person donating blood or a body part to someone to save or extend their life. That truly is a gift of something so personal a pricetag can't be put upon it. Organ donors promise that upon their decease needy individuals may be given their various vital organs, eyes, etc. to save a life or enhance bodily function. These kinds of gifts literally transform those who get them. If you ever receive such a physical gift you will probably think of and thank God for the person who sacrificed part of themselves for you. Love gifts change you forever – physically and spiritually.

Christmas is about the miraculous transformation that happens to everyone who receives God's Gift of Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord. When God the Son came wrapped in flesh (*John 1:14, 1 Timothy 3:16*), He was God's Gift to the world (*John 3:16-18*). His whole 33-year life was a gift of love from God showing us the ideal, perfect life possible if one is indwelt by God Himself. For those 33 years, the Gift of God, Jesus, was lived under the shadow of the cross waiting for Him in the end. That strange, foreboding Christmas tree would be His final and ultimate love gift for all who trust in what He did for us as He died upon it that day (*Romans 6:23*). Christ's love gift is the eternal life that flowed in His blood to erase our sin and implant God's grace in our soul. Christ's love gift life-transplant not only saves us from spiritual death, judgment, hell, and the Lake of Fire (*John 5:24*), but if it is truly received, transforms us spiritually, morally, socially, ethically, and in every part of our being (*Ephesians 4:21-24*).

The transformation caused by impartation of Christ's life into us is so fulfilling that true Christians can't keep quiet about it. If your life had been changed by a physical transplant, you would gladly tell others all about the donor's love gift of part of him or herself, wouldn't you? Of course, you couldn't in most cases because the donor would be dead. But with Christ, He didn't stay dead – since He was God in the flesh, He arose and is alive, back home in heaven. You can tell Him *thanks* and live a life now that takes care of the love gift of life He gave you (*Romans 10:9-13*). And, if you truly have received the Gift of Him, you really should tell others who are dying without Him, that since He is alive, Jesus can save and transform them as well if they ask for it from Him. If you are reading this and haven't experienced the transforming life that comes when you receive God's love Gift of Him, you still need Him as Savior and Lord (*2 Corinthians 5:17*). Tell Him in prayer right now that you are sorry for your sins that made Him have to die for you, that you need His forgiveness and that you want Him to come into you as Savior and Lord. The love Gift of the Savior is only a prayer away – receive Him today (*John 1:12*)!
